Mission Update

Letter from our CEO at SJRC



As June 30, 2018 marked the end of another fiscal year for SJRC Texas, I am amazed at all the accomplishments the organization experienced, and am very excited for what this coming fiscal year holds. Even more so, I am grateful for the many children and families that we cared for, and the healing that could transpire because of SJRC Texas, our staff, and our wonderful volunteers and donors. Because of you, we have successfully continued our mission to offer healing and hope to children and families affected by abuse, abandonment or neglect. Our vision is that abused and neglected children will be empowered to grow up to be happy, productive and caring adults. On behalf of SJRC Texas, I thank you for your generosity and support through it all. Your generosity and support transformed lives, met physical needs, and helped us to truly offer healing and hope to the children we care for. Only receiving 50% of our costs from the State of Texas leaves us with fundraising the remaining 50%, which is nearly 2 million dollars annually. Because this fiscal year was a bit of a struggle due to natural disasters and other changes in the fundraising landscape, we were just shy of meeting our annual fundraising goal.

As we move forward in the next fiscal year and beyond, I am proud of what SJRC Texas has accomplished, and excited about the future. This year alone, across our organization we worked with 400 volunteers, cared for close to 200 children/young adults, employed 92 dedicated staff and expanded our Board of Directors to 13 active members that have helped us dramatically increase our donor base and presence in the community. Our community and supporters are strong and vibrant. And together, we will continue our efforts to ensure that the children we care for, truly feel healing and hope. We are looking forward to much more in Fiscal Year 2019!

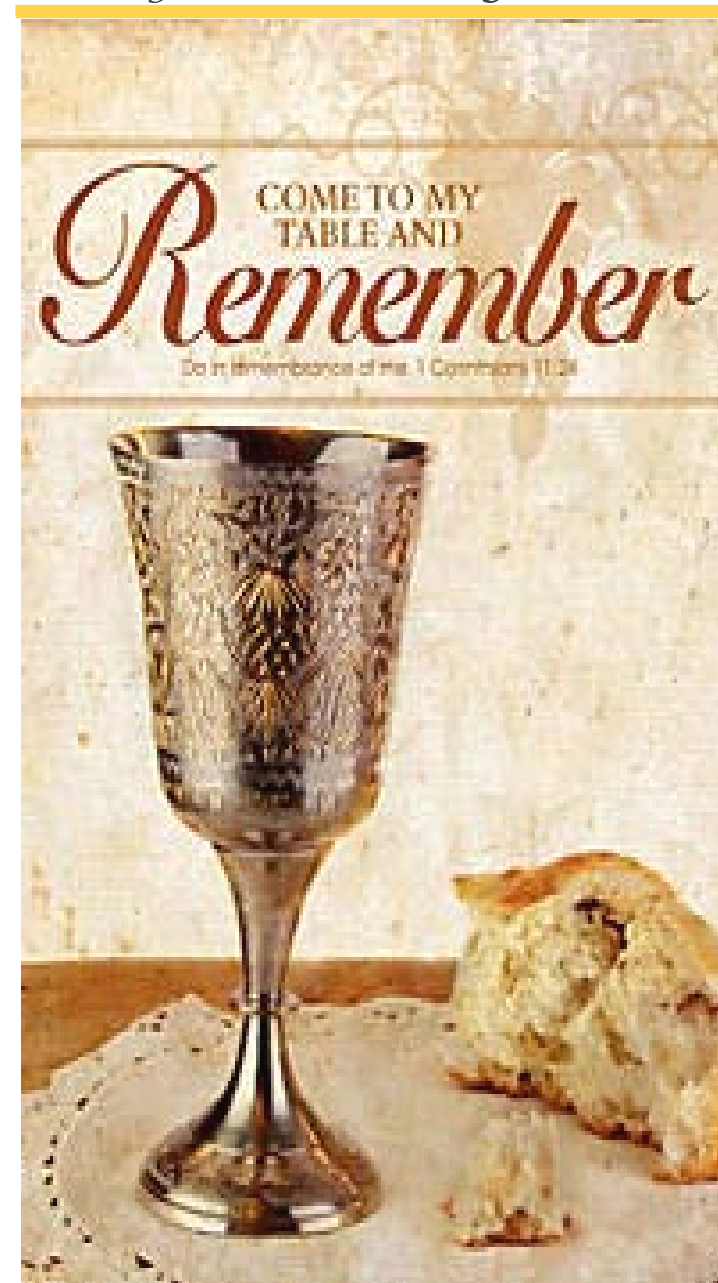
