Travels in India

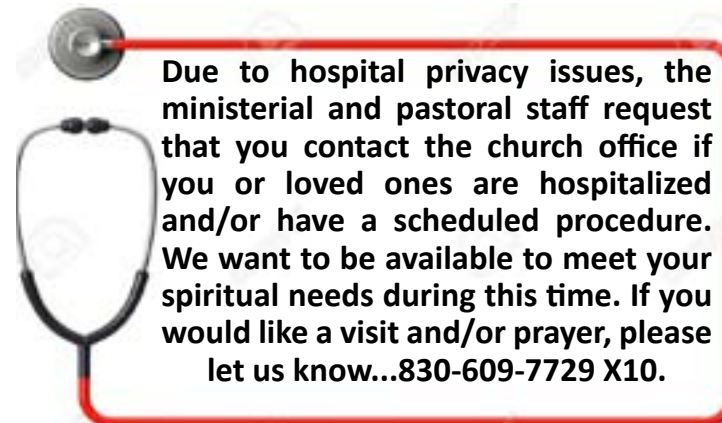
As soon as the new year began we took off on a long trip that would take us across India to many different states and cities to train new cross-cultural workers, meet with and encourage new pioneering teams, meet together with the South Asia Leadership Team, and to assist and mentor house fellowship planting teams on the ground.

First Jon spent two weeks with one of our new pioneering teams in Eastern India. He assisted them in running a bilingual training for new grassroots workers. The training was in both English and Nepali. Four teams were sent out from this program to locations across India and Nepal.

After those initial two weeks, we met up in Delhi with Jon's parents and then flew down to South India for our week-long South Asia Leadership Team meeting. While the grandparents took care of Amrita we were able to meet together with the other leaders and evaluate our progress, pray into what God is doing in India and make plans for the new year.

Then we traveled back to East India to conclude the training program. Back to Delhi to drop off Jon's parents and on to West India to meet with, encourage and mentor two of our House Fellowship planting teams in that region.

After two long months, we finally returned home to the Ashram. It was quite an adventure!

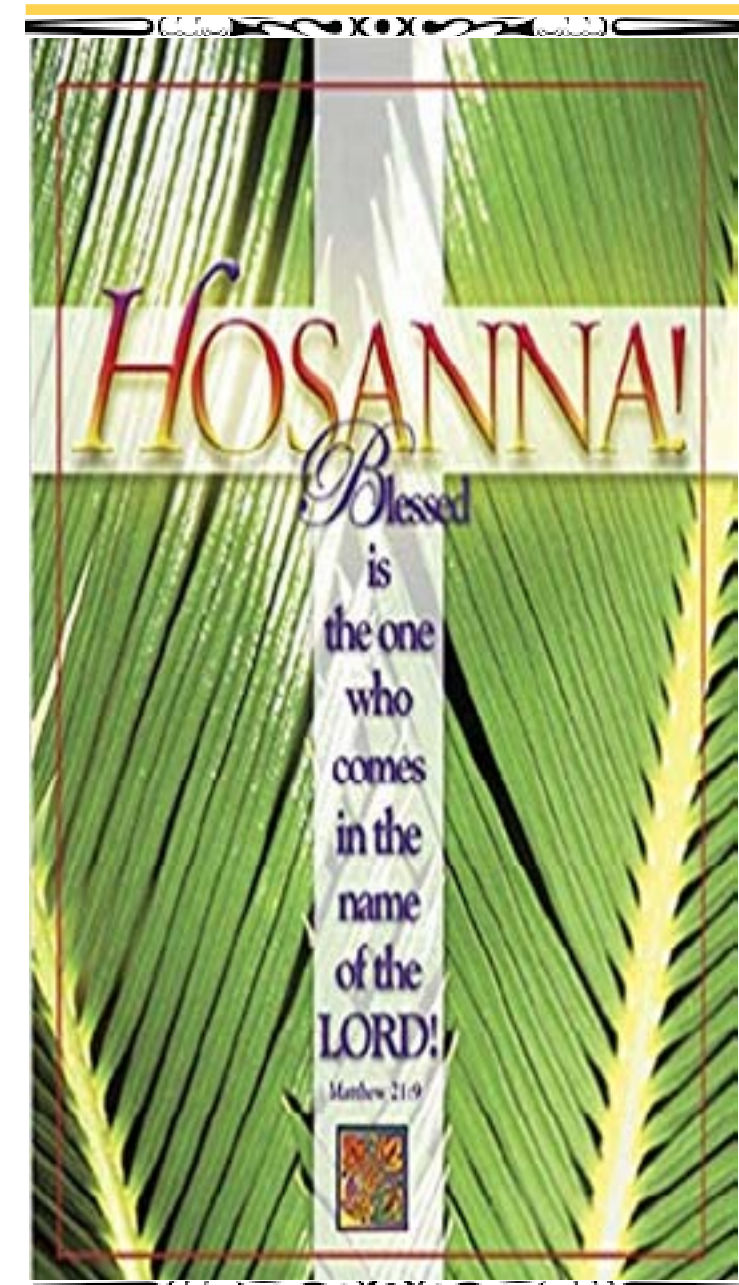
