Opportunities to Share with Curious and Seeking Muslim Students

How do we as followers of Jesus respond to the evil in this world? How do our Muslim friends respond to the evil of this world? A student of Tatiana's was asking these hard questions and sharing them with her. The student had written a poem about the injustices of this world, focusing on the recent death of Nusrat Jahan Rafi, a Bangladeshi girl who was set on fire and killed for complaining after being sexually harassed by a teacher (read more). The student broke down crying while expressing her frustration at Islam's corruption, acknowledging that many of the evil things happening in the world are happening in Muslim majority countries and that Muslim religious leaders are leading people astray. She told Tatiana that she doesn't believe Islam has the answers that she seeks, but she realizes that if she left her beliefs she would be seen as a traitor. She is seeking truth and is finding that Islam does not have the power to change people's hearts. Tatiana shared with her how Jesus spoke against the religious leaders of his day and also acknowledged that religious traditions did not change people's hearts.

Pray for more opportunities to share with this student about the beauty of Jesus' message to those just like her: people who are hurting and questioning and seeking light in the midst of the great darkness of this world. Pray for the country of Bangladesh, that Jesus would bring about true and lasting change in the midst of such great brokenness. (See a picture of all the participants in the poetry slam and the girl mentioned here on the back of our prayer sheet today.)

Tatiana also had the opportunity to show her students The Prince of Egypt, a movie adaptation of the Prophet Moses story. The movie provided opportunities for discussions about God's plan to bring about redemption through a sacrifice. She was able to connect the passover scene in the movie to Jesus' death on the cross and how it provided freedom from enslavement to our sins. We are thankful for how media opens doors for discussions like this. The team we will be joining in Bangladesh is heavily involved in creating media that shares the good news of Jesus.

Please pray for them as they create effective media resources that clearly communicate Jesus' love and lordship to Bengali Muslims.
