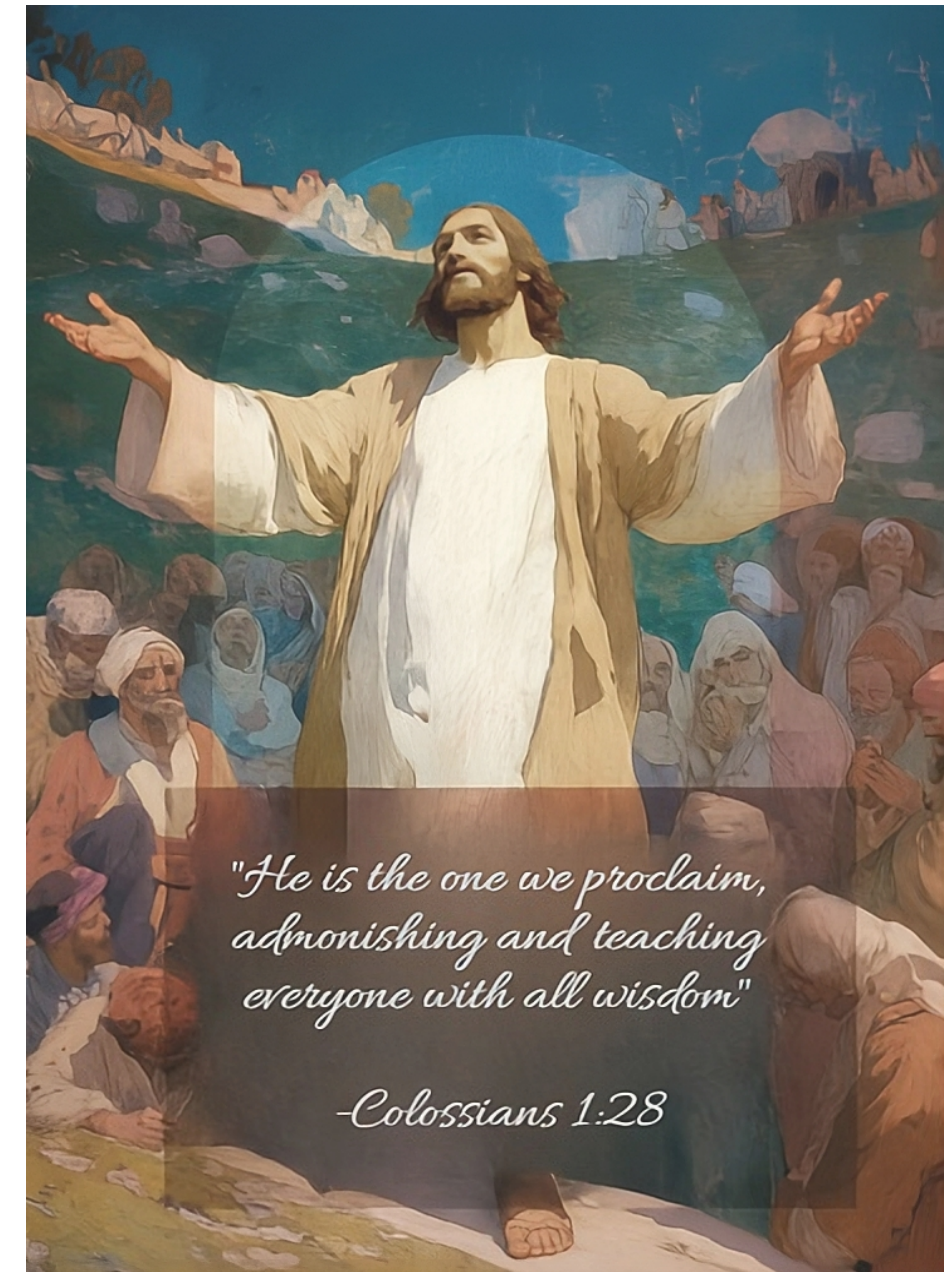

Preparing for the Lord’s Supper

*Both worship services partake the Lord’s Supper on the first Sunday of the month. FPC practices “open communion”, meaning each attendee is invited to partake in faith with humility & gratitude.

*FPC’s doctrinal statement, The Evangelical Catechism, explains the Lord’s Supper in a way that helps us prepare to partake in a worthy manner:

Q&A125: What is the Lord’s Supper? It is the sacrament by which we receive the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ as the nourishment of our new life, strengthen the fellowship with Christ and all believers, and confess that he died for us.

Q&A126: What blessings do we receive as we eat and drink the Lord’s Supper?

We receive forgiveness of sins, life and salvation (cf. 1 Corinthians 10:17 & 11:24, John 6:51 & 6:55-56.)
